Technological progress—from Gutenberg’s printing press to the microprocessor—brings many benefits but inevitably raises new societal issues as well. We are at the dawn of what may be one of the most profound technological advances of all time: when computers are enabled, in effect, to “think” like people, and in some respects greatly outperform human capabilities. This so-called “artificial” (really, “computational”) intelligence could help us to cure cancer, combat climate change and advance economic productivity. But if not developed and deployed properly, it could also exacerbate income inequality, discrimination and intrusions on our privacy.

New laws will be required to bring about the benefits of AI while minimizing associated risks. Crafting and applying such laws will require an understanding of a range of disciplines—across many areas of law, but also psychology, sociology, anthropology and other fields of study. This innovative CLE will bring together leaders in a wide range of disciplines who are thinking about how to harness the power of AI while avoiding harm.
